WHEN IS FATHER'S DAY? DEPENDS WHERE YOU ARE IN THE WORLD

As we know, Father's Day in the UK is celebrated on the third Sunday in June. This is also the case in the United States, Canada and India.

Many countries, including **Spain, Italy, Costa Rica a**nd **Croatia**, celebrate Father's Day on 19th March as this is the Feast Day of St Joseph.

In **Thailand**, Father's Day is celebrated on the late King Bhumibo's birthday, on the 5th of December. Seen as the father of Thailand, the country not only remembers him, but commemorates fathers everywhere. Tradition holds that everyone wears yellow on Father's Day, the "official colour" of Monday, the day of the week the King was born.

In **Russia**, Father's Day is celebrated on 23rd February and is known as 'Defender of the Fatherland Day'. It was originally created to support the people in the armed services and was made a state holiday in 2002 by President Putin. Now however, it has incorporated aspects of Father's Day from around the world, and gifts are given to important people in someone's life, including dads, husbands and boyfriends.

In **Australia** it is celebrated on the first Sunday in September as this is the date that, in 1964, the Commonwealth declared to be considered Father's Day.

The natives of Kathmandu Valley in **Nepal** honour their fathers on the day of *Gokarna Aunsi*, which occurs in late August and September, depending on the lunar calendar. It simply means 'day for looking at father's face' and begins on new moon day.

In Bulgaria, Father's Day is held on 26th December, because in the Bulgarian Orthodox Church this date is also St. Joseph's day, the patron saint of fathers.

In Taiwan, Father's Day is celebrated on 8th August. This is because in Mandarin Chinese the pronunciation of the number eight is bā, which is very similar to the word for dad: bà, Therefore the eighth day of the eighth month would be pronounced bā-bā and is a pun for daddy or papa (apparently)!

N.B. I'm never sure if it should be Father's day or Fathers' Day but I found this info online: "Father's Day" is spelled as a singular possessive following the precedent established by its predecessor, Mother's Day. In 1912, an American, Anna Jarvis, trademarked the phrase "Second Sunday in May, Mother's Day." Jarvis specifically noted that "Mother's" should "be a singular possessive, for each family to honour its own mother, not a plural possessive commemorating all mothers in the world."

So now we know!

WHAT'S GOING ON WITH OUR ROADS?

WSCC has issued a special edition of its residents' newsletter focusing the challenges currently faced with the condition of our roads and what they're doing to repair them.

"We understand how frustrated people feel about the exceptional number of defects currently present on some roads in West Sussex and the impact this has on travelling around the county.

We feel that frustration too and are <u>working hard to make improvements</u> using the resources available to us.

Like many other local councils across the UK, we have deteriorating roads due to a combination of factors:

- extreme fluctuations in weather, especially the wet spells earlier this year
- volume and weight of vehicles using the network
- not enough funding available to carry out all the repair works that need doing.

But we are facing the challenge head-on and pumping a multi-million pound package into a series of road repairs and improvements, to provide a road network we can all be proud of.

We'd like to thank our teams, suppliers and contractors, who are all working flat out to resolve the issues. Read more on the link below about our challenge and the work our Highways teams are completing across our 4,000kms of roads.
